## we should stand

**M**ike Gcabo is a relative newcomer to the game ranching industry, but the self-confessed 'serial entrepreneur' has already achieved the kind of success many entrants only dream about. He is a member of the Bloodline Africa group of rare game breeders and serves on the board of Wildlife Ranching South Africa (WRSA) – and this after having bought his farm in Lephalale, Limpopo, just three years ago.

As one of seven children growing up in Westonaria, Gauteng, Mike – the son of a construction company

foreman – was destined to be in the building industry. At the age of just 25, he became the director of the North West Housing Corporation and found himself serving in government shortly after South Africa's first democratic election in 1994. "Building houses for the poor was life-changing for me – it was a platform from which I could improve thousands of lives," he recalls. "When I look at my career, something central that emerges is my concern with empowering people."

Always on the lookout for business opportunities, Mike leased a farm in the Groot Marico district and



dabbled in farming with goats and Bonsmara cattle, but he was disappointed by the returns. "I thought there had to be something else; something that would give me the kind of return I was looking for," he recalls. "A friend suggested game
